## 2011-2012 Profile for College Admissions Officers

### District

Olentangy Local School District, located in southern Delaware County, covers 95 square miles and remains one of the fastest growing districts in Ohio and in the nation. The district is rated "Excellent with Distinction" by the State of Ohio; this is Ohio's highest rating for its public school districts.

### School

Olentangy High School, a 1999-2000 nationally recognized "Blue Ribbon School of Excellence", is a four year public high school (grades 9 - 12) with a present enrollment of 1,271 students. There are 288 students in the 2012 graduating class. Olentangy High School is rated "Excellent" by the State of Ohio Department of Education; this is Ohio's highest rating for its public high schools.

### Faculty

Olentangy High School has 95 certified staff. Of these, 77% have earned a Master's Degree or beyond.

### Graduation Requirements

The curriculum at Olentangy High School is comprehensive including advanced placement, honors, occupational, and vocational programs. For the graduating class of 2012, twenty-one credits will be required. Specific requirements include elective courses and the required course of study:

### Honors & Advanced Placement

Honors courses are available in Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, French V and German V. AP courses are offered in American Government/Politics, American History, European History, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Computer Science, Psychology, Art History, Music Theory, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics and Spanish.

Advanced Placement courses are weighted on a 5.0 scale. Honors courses are not weighted.
