
WEEKLY WINS

ATTENDANCE MODEL CHANGES

As a reminder, with the district's upcoming transition to full in-person, we want to assure our CDL families that this does not affect students in the CDL program. Committed Distance Learning is a semester-long commitment, which will continue through the end of the 2020-2021 second semester.

Because of this commitment, students can not move in or out of the program mid-

semester. Students currently enrolled in Committed Distance Learning will continue to learn virtually through the end of this school year.

MEAL ORDER FORM

Dear Olentangy Committed Distance Learning Families, Olentangy is happy to continue offering meals to all students in the Committed Distance Learning program at no charge for the month of March. Please use the [Committed Distance Learning March Pre-Order Form](#) to receive food service for students learning remotely during the month of March.

The government extended waivers allow meals that are ordered AND picked up for students enrolled in Olentangy schools available at no charge. By completing the form, you are committing to pick up meals ordered for your student(s). Please help us to conserve district time, funds, and valuable resources as Olentangy Schools is only reimbursed through these government waivers for meals that are picked up by families.

A few reminders for Committed Distance Learning families pre-ordering meals from Olentangy:

- Meal order forms need to be submitted by Tuesdays at 11:59 PM for the following week.
 - Menus are posted in the order form, or on the [Olentangy Schools Food Service website](#).
 - Meal pick-up is every Monday.
 - Families are able to select a pick-up location and time that works best for your schedule.
 - All meal pre-orders are for breakfast, lunch and 4 weekend fuel up packs.
 - Milk selection is yes or no. Milk is not required with meals.
 - Please submit a new order form for each student.
 - Families may order for multiple weeks at one time.
 - Families will receive an e-mail confirmation with a summary of the meal order.
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If you need to cancel or change your order, or have questions for Olentangy Food Service, please email CDLMeals@olsd.us. When emailing please include your student's name(s), ID number, and home school.
